Curriculum for Wales (CfW) - Year 2! How did we do last year, and where are we going now?

Staff worked incredibly hard last year to adopt a new approach to learning and teaching called *Understanding by Design*. This has a very strong focus on the process of learning and on enabling children to apply their learning in new situations - in other words, to *transfer* what they learn to new situations. It also fits perfectly with the 4 purposes at the heart of CfW. A purpose driven curriculum is one where the whole child is developed through knowledge, skills and experiences.




Prince William and Princess Catherine came to Grangetown Pavilion on Tuesday 3rd October.

They came to celebrate the 75th anniversary of the arrival of the HMT Empire Windrush to the UK and mark the start of *Black History Month*.

While they were in Cardiff, they came to the Pavilion to meet members of the *Windrush generation* and to celebrate the work of the diverse community groups in the area. Inside the Pavilion were displays celebrating the Windrush generation's stories – some of these are below.

When the Prince and Princess arrived, they were greeted by local schools – one of which was ours! We went and sang Calon Lan as the Royal couple arrived. Princess Catherine told us that she thought our singing was, 'Lovely' – and it really was – well done Y4!

We were very lucky to be selected as a school BAFTA for Kids and Place 2 Be chose to visit this year. They do lots of work on opening children's eyes to the possibilities of life in the arts, as well as the wellbeing that creativity and the arts can bring – not to mention the sheer pleasure TV and film.

The presenters were recognised by lots of the children - Joe Tasker, a youtuber and presenter, and Shanequa Paris best known for presenting Newsround

Years 3 to 6 came together in the hall and were shown a video about all the work the BAFTA roadshow does across the country. An *actual* BAFTA trophy was shown to the children. Who knew there were pictures on the back of it showing a TV and swirls - all of which represented science and the arts. Who knew it was made from bronze and marble! Wow!

The children also enjoyed a talk from John, an animator who works in Cardiff. He gave the children some advice as to how to work in that job. English and maths are very important, as is editing to improve work. Mrs Herbert reminded children that when we edit our work we also try to improve it! The children asked John what his favourite thing is, and he said that showing animations he has created, for the first time, and then getting great feedback is what he really enjoys.

The children asked the presenters who inspired them. Shanequa said presenters on Nickelodeon. Joe said his mum inspired him because she took him to rehearsals after she finished work. The children thoroughly enjoyed the assembly. Years 5 and 6 were then lucky enough to complete workshops with Joe and Shanequa – they all had a great time!
